

The Harm of White Supremacist-Born Stereotypes, Exclusions, & Representations

Racism



- Human difference does NOT make racisms, rather **racisms make 'race'**. Racism is the **outcome of human actions**, NOT the inevitable action of human difference.
- Desire to find **differences**, have **power**, find **justification** for **dispossession** that creates categories of 'race'.
- Many different kinds of racism each with own **histories**, **manifestations**, and **consequences**, which can become more intense depending on the **context**.

Racialization & Exclusion



- **Patterns** of cultural representation, knowledge production, and social organization. Historically **produced**, **invented**, **popularized** over time, and with real **material consequences**.
- Racializations are always **relational**; one group is racialized in relation to another group, giving meaning to **socially imagined difference**. Organized around **exclusion!**

Material Exclusions

- Access to wealth, services, territories, institutions, and life itself.



Social Exclusions

- Access to a particular kind of status, networks, social roles, and political rights.

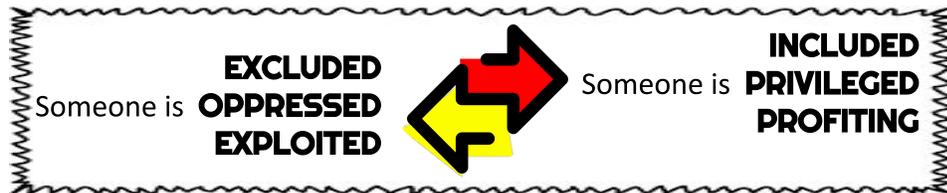


Symbolic Exclusions

- Not being represented, self-presentation ignored, and not taken seriously.

'Yellow Peril' (since 1900s)

- The racist stereotypes pose Asian migration as a threat to white supremacy and Asian challenge to European supremacy. Discourse functions to create an entity to fear & extinguish.

'Model Minority' (since 1960s)

- The stereotype circulates the myth of colorblindness. Model minority achievements as proof of meritocracy & racial liberalism.

"If you work hard you can make it..."

Continuity of Both Stereotypes (since 1980s)

- Both stereotypes are ambivalent & contradictory in meanings. Model minority seemingly positive a stereotype is **inseparable** from the yellow peril negative stereotype. Both are circular and allude a threat to white supremacy.

COVID-19 (since 2020)

"China Virus"

- Politicizing virus and **reviving deeply imbedded scapegoat ideas** of the yellow peril, and Anti-Asian violence in the US & Canada.

Stereotypes



- **Mechanisms** for making sense of the world, as dominant ideologies **differentiating self** from the world.
- Stereotypes do NOT only involve **making difference**, but also **simplify**, **fix**, and **exaggerate** meaning.
- The **difference is crucial to meaning**.

Two stereotypes of Asians exist on a continuum:

Model Minority vs **Yellow Peril**



- But both stereotypes are **inseparable** and underlined by **exclusion**.
- The **colorblindness** of 'Model Minority' attributes the consequences of **racial inequality** to individual **under performance**.
- Both stereotypes are **inseparable** and **circular** as both present a **threat to white supremacy**.

Film & Media

- Film as a way of **raising student consciousness**, but ALSO a **signifying practice** and a tool for resistance or subversion. If racialization is about signifying practice, film is a **way of circulating those significations**.
- Literature and cinema can be a **political forces of mass deception**. Denying the humanity of communities by **restricting to narrowly defined roles** by the gatekeepers of mass media.
- Plays a crucial role in **constructing categories** that reinscribe **racial hierarchies** mirroring the **political climate** of the day. Film has contributed to the spread of anti-Blackness, Orientalism, and white-supremacy.



"Cinema is a teaching tool – pedagogical tool; filmmakers may not intend to teach but that does not mean that lessons are not learned"

Representation



Signs, symbols, words, phrases & sounds that **communicate meaning**. Human beings come to know the world through representations.

- Representations reappear in **new forms** to confuse the average viewer (*e.g., in film and media*) ... Lulling us into the **delusion** that **racist discourses have changed** completely.
- The circulation of representations works to **disposes and exclude** in order to **colonize and secure a Western reality**.

Building a Better Future



- We must understand that **racisms are multiple**, have **NO essential form**. Thus, we must approach **anti-racism** in the same way.
- Promote **deracialized inclusions** and **mitigate consequences** of racialization.
- Importance of **specificity**, and paying attention to the **context**. Must think about **racial meanings** locally & globally.
- Thinking '**and**' NOT 'either/or'. Committing to **dismantle, undo, unlearn, deny, abolish** racist rule through **international solidarities**.
- Change over time allows us to understand the constructed nature of seemingly permanent categories.
- Developing language that admits the reality of racist injury **without reproducing** the categories that are the problem.
- Thinking about our relationship to the subject and our willingness to look our own power and privilege in relation to what we are talking about.

Beneficial for acknowledgement of the historic role people in the West played in creating chaos in the 'Third World'. Calling NOT for charity & empathy but an analysis of intertwined systems of anti-blackness, orientalism, global white supremacy.

Language & Images



- Language about race does NOT record or document an objective reality of real biological, social & cultural difference; rather **language creates the idea of such difference**.
- Categories are **historically invented**, created & reinvented.
- Racialization happens through stories, symbols, words, phrases, and sounds. None of these images are innocent, they are **created, circulated, and taken for granted** at the social level having **material consequences**.



Power

- Power is required to **organize exclusions** and efforts of multiple individuals.
- State systems **organize violence** and have the capacity to **mask the violence & 'justify' their actions**.
- Works to **maintain** anti-Blackness, Orientalism, and white supremacy.



"If we can name who is the doer then we have a way of getting accountability.... Naming the institutions/machines is too amorphous..."
