Transformative Justice:

structures which have historically allowed the law to be used in ways that privilege some and oppress others. Transformative justice is a socio-political framework which seeks to

dismantle these structures along with the violence and harm they produce. According to the writing of Mia Mingus, transformative justice is, at a

foundational level, a form of harm reduction focused on "making things" right," and approaching justice from a standpoint of collective engagement, as opposed to punitive state tactics.
